

About

Harris County, Texas has been in the business of economic development and growth since 1836. Named for John R. Harris, founder of Harrisburg, Harris County has four precincts and is governed by a Commissioners Court. A county judge - elected countywide - and four commissioners - each elected by precinct - preside over the Court.

Since 1990, Harris County's population has grown 67% and become the third most populous county in the United States. Residents and businesses thrive and expand by benefiting from an overall cost of living that is 3% below the national average, advantageous geographic location, and a competitive housing cost index that is 22% lower than the national average. Well-established global networks such as a major seaport, two international airports, a world-class highway system, and three major railroad companies connect Harris County and the Gulf of Mexico to the U.S. interior and the world.

In 2021, Harris County's \$115.6 billion exported goods - accounting for 82.1% of all goods exported from the Houston Metro area - clinched the number one spot as the largest single-county exporter in the U.S. A relatively low overall tax burden with no state and local income tax - provides Harris County with a competitive edge on the global stage. Businesses enjoy nimble land use regulations and business-friendly labor rules along with competitive business and permitting compliance costs. A streamlined construction approval process by Harris County allows companies to identify sites, gain construction approval, and build their facilities quickly.







PORT HOUSTON

Port Houston is the largest Texas port, the busiest U.S. waterway, and the largest Gulf Coast container port. Handling 73% of U.S. Gulf Coast container traffic in 2022, the port has the largest U.S. facility for raw plastic resin exports and is also the nation's largest exporter of petroleum and related products.

The port is home to the largest petrochemical complex in the U.S. Port Houston and the surrounding area has an extensive intermodal network of terminals, roads, rails (with access to Class-1 railroads), and pipelines.


TEXAS MEDICAL CENTER

The Texas Medical Center is the world's largest medical complex and home to the world's largest children's hospital and cancer hospital. It is the eighth largest business district in the U.S.

There are more than 60 member institutions, including 21 hospitals, 20 colleges and universities, eight academic and research institutions, four medical schools, and even the world's largest steam and chilled water facility.

At the forefront of advancing life sciences for the past 75 years, 20 percent of all U.S. trials are conducted at the Medical Center.



Harris County is ideal for business with low business costs and a favorable tax climate. Not only are taxes low, utility costs and insurance rates for unemployment and workers compensation are business-friendly as well.



DOING BUSINESS AS (DBA)

A DBA filing is required if a business is not incorporated or if one is conducting business under a name other than that in which the business was incorporated. A DBA is \$17 plus \$0.50 for each additional name filed in Harris County. Please visit Harris County Clerk's office for details.

LICENSES & PERMITS

Obtaining licenses and permits varies by industry and regulatory agency. Please visit the State of Texas portal or the Texas Department of Licensing & Regulations.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

The general entry rate for unemployment insurance is 2.7%, which is charged on the first \$9,000 in earnings and reassessed after six quarters and charged at own experience rate.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE


The State of Texas does not require Workers' Compensation insurance. Other options include self-insurance, state-operated Texas Workers' Compensation Insurance Fund, or licensed private insurance company.

PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION

Tax rates are per \$100 Certified Taxable Appraised Value, and the same tax rates apply to all items. Real property and Tangible Personal Property are taxed in the State of Texas. Real Property includes land and buildings, while Tangible Personal Property means personal property that can be seen, weighed, measured, felt, or otherwise perceived by the senses. Quality of Life



With housing costs 22% below the national average, the highest GDP growth in Texas, and 25 school districts, Harris County is a great community to live in and work in. Five professional major-league sports

teams, including the two-time World Championship-winning Houston Astros, draw fans locally and nationwide. The Museum District is home to 19 museums and the second most-visited zoo in the U.S. The Theater District hosts nine renowned performing arts organizations.

Nearly 8,000 restaurants are located in Harris County, with an abundance of international cuisines to choose from. Shopping opportunities abound from Texas' largest mall, The Galleria, to antique shopping in quaint Old Town Spring. Quality of life is enhanced by miles of beautiful trails, nearly 200 Harris County parks, and unique events like the Houston Rodeo, the largest in the world.

Residents and visitors alike can receive health care at world-class medical hospitals such MD Anderson Cancer Center, the top ranked cancer hospital in the U.S. In addition to the Texas Medical Center, premier health care facilities are located throughout the county.
